GENERAL INFORMATION AND DEADLINES

• Scope and Program

The second international workshop of Intense field-Short Wavelength Atomic and Molecular Processes (ISWAMP-2) will be held in Xi'an (China), July 20-22, 2013. The international ISWAMP-2 meeting will bring together researchers working with short wavelength sources of radiation to study atomic and molecular processes using intense fields and/or ultrashort time-scales. The workshop will include talks and posters on recent scientific and technical developments in the rapidly developing fields of x-ray free electron lasers, extreme ultraviolet radiation, high harmonic generation and attosecond science.

The following topics are planned:

- 1. Excitation, ionization and fragmentation in intense EUV and X-ray fields
- 2. Non-linear processes in EUV and X-ray
- 3. Developments in short-wavelength free electron lasers
- 4. Developments in HHG-attosecond light sources
- 5. Instrumentation for ISWAMP
- 6. New approaches to intense UV and X-ray generation

The above-mentioned fees include supplement for credit or debit card payment (3%).

*Cancellation and Refund Policy

Cancellations must be submitted in writing to the Conference Office. A cancellation fee in the amount of about CNY 300 will be charged for cancellation requests received before 14 June, 2013. After 14 June, 2013 the conference fee will not be refunded, even in the case of non-participation.

All cancellation requests must be processed by the Local Committee of ISWAMP-2. Upon receipt of your request the Local Committee will inform you of the status of your request. Refunds are expected to take 7-30 days to process.

VISA AND TRAVEL AUTHORIZATION

Conference participants from most countries will be required to obtain a visa to enter China. Conference participants can apply for a Chinese visa through a travel agency or directly at local Chinese embassy or consulate. For attending conference, one can apply for either a tourist visa (Visa L) or a business visa (Visa F). Conference participants should check the visa requirements well in advance. The Chinese Visa Application Service Centre at local Chinese embassy or consulate provides helpful information on how to apply for a Chinese visa.

The ISWAMP2013 organizer encourages participants to apply for their visas as early as possible. No visa is required for ordinary passport holders from some countries (e.g. Singapore, Brunei and Japan) to visit China for up to 15 days. Conference participants are strongly recommended to consult the local Chinese Embassy or Consulate for the most current requirements and those specific to their situations.



Visa L(the Tourist Visa)

The participants are strongly encouraged to apply for the tourist visa (Visa L), for the apply procedure will be much simpler than Visa F. You'd better find a local travel agency, and ask them to help you to apply visa L. TRAVEL AND TRANSPORTATION

Air Service: Xi'an Xianyang International Airport (XIY) is located about 47km (29.2 miles) from downtown Xi'an. Xi'an has direct international air routes to Singapore, Nagoya and Seoul, along with connecting flights to Paris, Frankfurt, Los Angeles, Delhi, Bangkok, Tokyo, Nagoya and Singapore via Shanghai (Pudong). It also serves about 191 air routes from Xi'an to the main cities of China. Major airlines (Air China, China Eastern, China Southern, Hainan Airlines *etc.*) and their worldwide partners have convenient connecting flights to Xi'an from hubs in Beijing, Shanghai, Guangzhou, Lanzhou, Urumqi and Chongqing *etc.* (For detailed information please visit <u>Xianyang International Airport</u> website.)

*Note: You are strongly advised to check the information from official airline



websites yourself before booking your itinerary and to book your flight 1-2 months in advance.

Taxi: The cost is about 160CNY from the airport to the downtown area.

Airport Shuttle Bus: The cost is 25CNY per person (single). It usually takes about one hour for the airport shuttle bus to get to Bell Tower in West Main Street, where is about 2 km to the Grand Metropark Hotel.

Railway Service: The railway station is located in the North Huancheng Road of Xi'an, about 2.5 km to the Grand Metropark Hotel. Welcome Reception



The welcome reception will be held on **Friday 19 July, 2013, from 18:00 to 21:00**. The reception will take place at the Grand Metropark Hotel. On-site registration will be open from 13:00 to 21:00. Nearby Sightseeing Options

City Wall: Xi'an was originally a walled city, which was erected in the 14th century Ming Dynasty, and even today the wall is considered a landmark dividing the city into the inner part and the outer part. We suggest exploring it at night before 20:00.

Bell Tower: It is a wooden structure topped with dark green tiles. It is a grand ancient building with traditional Chinese architectural features. There used to be a huge iron bell hung in the bell tower, which was used to strike the hours. On the top of the Bell Tower, visitors can get a bird's eye view of the surrounding areas and the building's brightly-decorated eaves.

County, 30 kilometers from Xi'an City, Huaqing Pool is a famous resort in China. Not only famous for its exquisite scenery, but also for the romantic love story of Emperor Xuanzong (685-762) and his consort Yang Yuhuan in the Tang Dynasty.

Terracotta Warriors and Horses: It is a collection of terracotta sculptures depicting the armies of Qin Shi Huang, the first Emperor of China. It is a form of funerary art buried with the emperor in 210–209 BC and whose purpose was to protect the emperor in his after life. The Terracotta Army was discovered in March 1974 by a farmer. So far, 1,868 terracotta warriors and chariots have been unearthed.

Forest of Stone Tablets Museum(Bei Lin): Established in 1090 during the Northern Song Dynasty (960 – 1279), which is well-known nationally for a fine and large collection of more than 1, 000 inscribed stones, engraved during a 2,000 year period from the Han Dynasty (206 BC – 220 AD) to the Qing Dynasty (1644 – 1911). It is a good place to get close to Chinese history and culture.
