



GENERAL INFORMATION AND DEADLINES

Scope and Program

The second international workshop of Intense field-Short Wavelength Atomic and Molecular Processes (ISWAMP-2) will be held in Xi'an (China), July 20-22, 2013. The international ISWAMP-2 meeting will bring together researchers working with short wavelength sources of radiation to study atomic and molecular processes using intense fields and/or ultrashort time-scales. The workshop will include talks and posters on recent scientific and technical developments in the rapidly developing fields of x-ray free electron lasers, extreme ultraviolet radiation, high harmonic generation and attosecond science.



About Xi'an City

Xi'an, located in central-northwest China, records the great changes of the country just like a living history book. It is the capital of Shaanxi province, a sub-provincial city and one of the oldest cities in China, with more than 3,100 years of history. The city was known as Chang'an before the Ming Dynasty (1368-1644). Xi'an also is one of the Four Great Ancient Capitals of China, having held the position under several of the most important dynasties in Chinese history, including Zhou, Qin, Han, Sui, and Tang. Xi'an is the eastern terminus of the Silk Road and home to the Terracotta Army (7,000 terracotta statues of Qin Bingmayong Bowuguan warriors and soldiers, dating from 210 BCE, were discovered in 1974, and are still being excavated). And this city also is an important cultural, industrial and educational centre of the central-northwest region. There are a few famous universities and institutes for research and development, national security and China's space exploration program. It's now one the most populous metropolitan areas in inland China with more than 8 million inhabitants.




- a) The registration fee includes the meeting material printing costs, venue rental, coffee breaks, welcome reception *etc*. The cost of the conference banquet is NOT included in the registration fee and should be purchased separately.

Lunch and Dinner


Lunch and dinner are not included in the registration fee. There are plenty of restaurants available nearby.



Submissions of abstracts

- 6. New approaches to intense UV and X-ray generation


The abstract should be sufficiently detailed to enable the conference committee to judge the scientific merit of the paper. Submissions accepted as contributed talks, you will be notified via e-mail after selection by the committee. Abstracts can only be submitted through the conference website where step-by-step instructions are given. Abstracts submitted by any other means will not be considered. The file containing the abstract must be uploaded to the conference website in PDF or Word format using the template given on the website. The length of each abstract is strictly limited to one page. You will be notified by e-mail in May 2013 when your abstract has been received.

The deadline for abstract submission is 1 May, 2013.

Poster Presentation

All accepted contributed posters will be presented in the afternoon of 20 July. Space dimensions of 100 cm (width) \times 120 cm (height) will be allocated to each poster. Posters may be presented only if the corresponding abstract has been accepted and if at least one of the authors listed has registered for the conference.

The posters should be prepared before 15:00 on July 20 and be removed by the author before 20:30 on July 20.



TRAVEL AND TRANSPORTATION

Air Service: Xi'an Xianyang International Airport (XIY) is located about 47km (29.2 miles) from downtown Xi'an. Xi'an has direct international air routes to Singapore, Nagoya and Seoul, along with connecting flights to Paris, Frankfurt, Los Angeles, Delhi, Bangkok, Tokyo, Nagoya and Singapore via Shanghai (Pudong). It also serves about 191 air routes from Xi'an to the main cities of China. Major airlines (Air China, China Eastern, China Southern, Hainan Airlines *etc.*) and their worldwide partners have convenient connecting flights to Xi'an from hubs in Beijing, Shanghai, Guangzhou, Lanzhou, Urumqi and Chongqing *etc.* (For detailed information please visit Xianyang International Airport website.)

*Note: You are strongly advised to check the information from official airline websites yourself before booking your itinerary and to book your flight 1-2 months in advance.

Taxi: The cost is about 160CNY from the airport to the downtown area.

Airport Shuttle Bus: The cost is 25CNY per person (single). It usually takes about one hour for the airport shuttle bus to get to Bell Tower in West Main Street, where is about 2 km to the Grand Metropark Hotel.



ISWAMP-2 will take place at **Grand Metropark Hotel**, a **five-star** hotel located in the center of Xi'an city. The Grand Metropark Hotel Xi'an has a wide range of spacious guestrooms and suites, fully equipped with Internet access, in-room safes and luxury bathroom amenities.



Nearby Sightseeing Options


City Wall: Xi'an was originally a walled city, which was erected in the 14th century Ming Dynasty, and even today the wall is considered a landmark dividing the city into the inner part and the outer part. We suggest exploring it at night before 20:00.

Bell Tower: It is a wooden structure topped with dark green tiles. It is a grand ancient building with traditional Chinese architectural features. There used to be a huge iron bell hung in the bell tower, which was used to strike the hours. On the top of the Bell Tower, visitors can get a bird's eye view of the surrounding areas and the building's brightly-decorated eaves.

Drum Tower: It is located to the northwest of the Bell Tower, as a similar structure to the Bell Tower. On the outside of the Drum Tower at ground level hang many large drums. Each one is decorated with beautiful Chinese writing, which invokes good



fortune. A kind of drum show is performed here everyday. The top of the tower commands a panoramic view of the city.

Huaqing Pool: It is Located at the northern foot of Lishan Mountain in Lintong County, 30 kilometers from Xi'an City, Huaqing Pool is a famous resort in China. Not only famous for its exquisite scenery, but also for the romantic love story of Emperor Xuanzong (685-762) and his consort Yang Yuhuan in the Tang Dynasty.

Terracotta Warriors and Horses: It is a collection of terracotta sculptures depicting the armies of Qin Shi Huang, the first Emperor of China. It is a form of funerary art buried with the emperor in 210–209 BC and whose purpose was to protect the emperor in his after life. The Terracotta Army was discovered in March 1974 by a farmer. So far, 1,868 terracotta warriors and chariots have been unearthed.



Forest of Stone Tablets Museum(Bei Lin): Established in 1090 during the Northern Song Dynasty (960 - 1279), which is well-known nationally for a fine and large collection of more than 1, 000 inscribed stones, engraved during a 2,000 year period from the Han Dynasty (206 BC - 220 AD) to the Qing Dynasty (1644 - 1911). It is a good place to get close to Chinese history and culture.

Big Wild Goose Pagoda: Built in 652 during the Tang Dynasty. One of the pagoda many functions was to hold sutras and figurines of the Buddha that were brought to China from India by the Buddhist translator and travelers Xuanzang. Now this well-preserved holy place for Buddhist has been the symbol of Xian.


